Most recently it was scientifically grounded by the research and theories of Sigmund Freud, Jean Piaget, and Erik Erikson. Perhaps the first full-length study to explore current issues in early childhood education through the lens of postcolonial theory, this book will be of considerable value to those involved in education, child development, developmental psychology social anthropology and sociology.
